International Day of UN Peacekeepers 29 May

Jesus said, "Blessed are the peacemakers". In our times, United Nations peacekeepers have served in situations of war and civil war in over seventy countries across four continents, working towards lasting peace. Wednesday marks the International Day of UN

Since 1948, when the first mission began in Palestine, over a million people have served under the United Nations flag in peacekeeping missions around the world, and over 3,700 have died protecting the most vulnerable and saving countless lives. The iconic "Blue Helmets" and their distinctive white vehicles have become a familiar part of the iconography of global conflict, and while deployments have sometimes been controversial, they have had perhaps the most visible impact of any UN initiative. However, the UN flag no longer offers the protection it once did and casualties among peacekeepers are higher than ever, making this year's International Day especially poignant. 👻

Pilgrimages to Santiago de Compostela go back to the ninth century when, it is claimed, the bones of St James were discovered there. By the twelfth century it had become very popular, but by the 1950s numbers had declined. The modern revival of the Camino is down to parish priest Don Elias, who in 1984 drove the route painting yellow arrows. Nowadays thousands of people follow the route each year.

Modern pilgrims have it relatively easy, since it is now possible to find an albergue (hostel) in most villages. We pilgrims tended to walk at different paces, so as we went we were always meeting new people to share a bit of the journey with.

Acts 16. 9-15

Gospel Reading

John 14. 23-29

Jesus answered him, 'Those who love me will keep my word, and my Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them. Whoever does not love me does not keep my words; and the word that you hear is not mine, but is from the Father who sent me.

'I have said these things to you while I am still with you. But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid. You heard me say to you, 'I am going away, and I am coming to you." If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father, because the Father is greater than I. And now I have told you this before it occurs, so that when it does occur, you may believe.

Second Reading

Revelation 21.10,22 -22. 5

And in the spirit he carried me away to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God.

I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb. The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. Its gates will never be shut by dayand there will be no night there. People will bring into it the glory and the honour of the nations. But nothing unclean will enter it, nor anyone who practises abomination or falsehood, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life.

The River of Life

Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb through the middle of the street of the city. On either side of the river is the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, producing its fruit each month; and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations. Nothing accursed will be found there any more. But the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him; they will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads. And there will be no more night; they need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign for ever and ever.
