

LYMPSHAM OPEN GARDENS

Saturday 15 June & Sunday 16 June 2019

2.00 – 5.00 p.m.

A great way to spend a summer afternoon visiting three of Lympsham's foremost gardens at the Manor, Church Farm next to the Church and Worthy House opposite the cricket pitch. This year, the garden at Worthy House is open for the first time.

For those who don't know the gardens, the Manor is set in 10 acres of formal and semi-formal garden, surrounded by paddocks and farmland. It boasts a carefully preserved, fully working Victorian kitchen garden and greenhouse, an arboretum of trees from all parts of the world, a large stocked fishpond and a beautiful old rose garden.

Its neighbour, Church Farm, has a 3/4 acre informal English country garden surrounding the old farmhouse, a well-stocked herbaceous border, shrub lined paths, raised vegetable beds and a small courtyard herb garden.

Worthy House has well-stocked herbaceous borders, shrubs, climbing roses, clematis and hydrangeas, together with a small wooded area leading to a kitchen garden, boasting vegetables, kiwi, a potting shed and greenhouse

Tea, cakes and a plant stall will be on offer and visitors can top off their afternoon by a visit to the church and a stroll through one of the county's prettiest villages, perhaps taking in a cricket match on the cricket field, next to the school.

The event is principally to raise funds for the National Garden Scheme, a charity which supports causes such as McMillan Cancer UK and other cancer and nursing charities but proceeds from the tea and cake stall and plant stall go to the church in Lympsham.
