Save Our Special Ceiling



St Michael's Church in Brent Knoll has a **very** special medieval carved wooden ceiling in its north aisle. It features 96 panels, each carved with its own unique design, plus 24 Angels and 6 bosses. As this is currently under threat from a leaking lead roof above it, we invite you to sponsor a feature to help repair the roof and save our special ceiling.

Save Our Special Ceiling

St Michael's Church is a key landmark in Brent Knoll. The church has a number of important features that mark it out as a special church. The most famous of these are the Fox and Goose bench ends and the John Somerset Memorial.



We also have a priceless special ceiling in the north aisle. The ceiling is made up of 96 panels. Each is carved uniquely. This ceiling is currently under threat because the lead roof above it is leaking, which can damage the wood underneath. We will be replacing the lead above this special ceiling at a cost of around £45k. A significant amount of this will be obtained through grants. But we will still need to raise at least £15K ourselves to cover project costs.

How Can You Help?

There are many ways in which you can help during the next few months:

• Sponsoring a Ceiling panel, Angel or Boss. We will be seeking sponsorship for sections of the roof from local parishioners, organisations and businesses. Support gives you an option for your name or organisation to be included in a Register that will be displayed in the church.

Bronze Donations: Up to £99. A share in one of the 96 Ceiling panels.

Silver Donations: Minimum £100 (No maximum). A Ceiling panel.

Gold Donations: Minimum £150 (No maximum). An Angel.

Platinum Donations: Minimum £200 (No maximum). A Boss.

- Gift aiding donations. If you are an individual giving a donation we can claim Gift Aid on your donation and this is worth 25% extra over and above the sum that you give. This does not apply if the donation comes from a business or organization.
